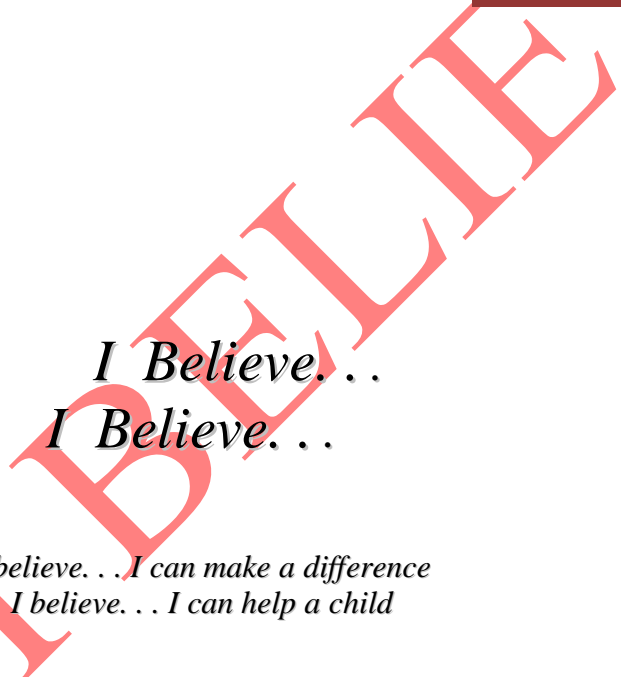

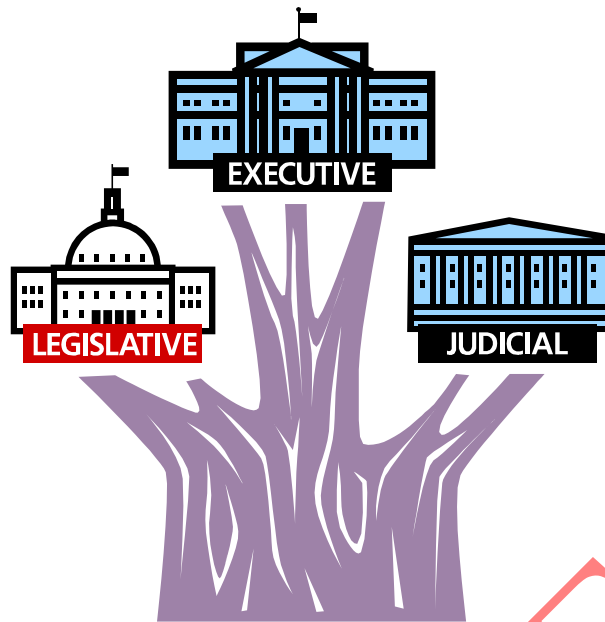

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE....

There are several child support bills pending in the current session of the NC General Assembly and one bill that has been ratified.

House Bill 307 (S587) Set Aside Child Support/ Limited Circumstances

This bill has passed the House and is now in the J I Committee of the Senate. In a nutshell this is a paternity disestablishment bill that would allow for paternity to be set aside more readily than under the existing law.

Senate Bill 143 Continue Child Support/21 Yrs/College Students

This bill has passed the Senate and passed the first reading in the House and has been sent to the Committee on Juvenile Justice. This bill extends the payment of child support to age 21 if the "child" is in college. Also, it provides that the payee could become the "child" or that the \$\$ be "paid directly towards the child's college expenses".

Senate Bill 817 Increase Child Support Collections

This bill has passed both the Senate and the House and will be sent to the Governor for signature. This bill amends NCGS 5A-12 and provides that a person who is held in CRIMINAL contempt may be subject to a sentence of up to 120 days.
